This Newsletter allows me

to pay tribute to the Brothers who greatly contributed to our formation structures for years and have just been appointed to other duties. I think about Brother Pierre Ouattara, Director of CELAF-INSTITUT until September 2011, who has just joined the CIL formation team in Rome and Brother Marius Boya, Secretary for RELAF and the origin of RELAF Newsletter, who has just been appointed Director of Bishop Steinmetz College, Bohicon in Benin. To these two brothers, I would say that if men did not know how to thank them as it should, God will do. Brothers, thank you for your dedicated service to the Region. We pray the Lord to sustain you in the accomplishment of your new mission. With these two brothers, we welcome those who have just accepted responsibility in the service of the Lasallian mission in our Region or in the center of the Institute. May the good Lord accompany you throughout your Lasallian journey!

By relaunching our Newsletter, we hope to go by the schedule we have set: an issue every three months in order to share the RELAF news. Many things happen in our Region but communication fails to share these experiences. However, this promise cannot be adequately met if this means of communication and information is only the concern of the Regional Office. Each District, Sector and Delegation in RELAF communicated with the person in charge of communication,

who has to take care of collecting information to share and publish the Newsletter which comes out with the support of his Brother Visitor.

It seems that the first two publications did not reach all parts of the RELAF to the extent that many still ignore the existence of this means of communication. It would be unfortunate that this information does not circulate while we all desire to know what is happening in the Lasallian mission around us. Each publication is sent to all members of Br. Visitors' Conference and to all persons in charge of communication. It is up to them to make sure that the information reaches all.

In the first publication, we discovered through the historical overview the struggles that accompanied the transfer of *Our Lady of Grace Novitiate* in Kinshasa to Bobo-Dioulasso. Very few people still remembered this story. This number also allowed us to know the statistics of our formation house. In this publication, we have an historical overview of Saint Miguel Scholasticate in Abidjan. There are still discoveries to be made in our recent past: the historical CELAF, the CLAF, the Novitiate in Nairobi, De La Salle Centre in Nairobi, CTIE within Tangaza in Nairobi, and so on.

This return to sources, if complete, enables us to better understand our present to consider our future with confidence. The next step in this area will be the creation of a Website for RELAF Region. The major issues concerning the animation of the Region are treated at the Visitors' conference, once a year for the entire Region, twice a year for the French-speaking zone. The latest took place in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) from 7 to 12 November 2011. The next conference for the French-speaking zone will be held in Abidjan from 25 to 31 March 2012 and the Regional conference from 4 to 7 November 2012, also in Abidjan. Reports are available to Brother Visitors. This December publication gives me the opportunity to wish you a good preparation to welcome the coming of our Savior. May his coming relieve us from our anxieties and give us serenity so that we may be able to live up to our responsibilities.

CELAF and Saint Miguel: One single structure:

The idea of creating an Inter-African Center goes back to 1987 with the leadership of Brother Vincent Rabemahafaly then general councilor for Africa and Madagascar. Two years earlier, the Novitiate "Our Lady of Grace" in Kinshasa was opened as the Inter-African Novitiate. The idea of having an inter-African scholasticate was also on its way. It was then made operational on October, 1991 with the opening of African Lasallian Centre (CELAF), always with a strong involvement of the General Councilor, Brother Vincent R. and Brother Marcellin RAKOTOFIRINGA, Regional at the time.

1991-1996

The opening of this centre led to the Christian Brothers of RELAF to establish the Scholasticate community, called "Saint Miguel". Br. François de Salle Brother Odon RAZAFINDRAKOTO as Director, Br. RAHARALILAO Hilaire, Director of African Lasallian Centre (CELAF) and Paul KABORE, Bursar. The three brothers became the staff leader of the emerging structure. Since infrastructures (rooms, halls of course) were not yet ready to welcome Brothers, the pioneers enjoyed the hospitality of the ICAO. For three months, the Brothers were staying in ICAO where they also took some courses.

The community had 15 scholastic Brothers from different districts: West Africa (4), Douala (3), Antananarivo(4), Zaire (2) and the Delegation of Rwanda (2). Six Brothers of this first group in Saint Miguel left the Institute: two from Rwanda, two from the former Zaire, one from Douala and Madagascar. The six Brothers still persevere today; one of them, Brother Jacques BOTONDO of Douala and who was part of Haiti Sector, but later left the Institute.

In the early beginning, the history of Saint Miguel community was linked to that of CELAF. Apart from the financial issues, the two structures were linked. The various informations, the only sources available to us make it clear that: the construction of buildings, community organization and its activities, the management of physical assets, teachers, playgrounds, library etc...all these indicated that the separation was not that obvious.

At the very beginning, all the Scholastic Brothers were enrolled at the senior level in CELAF. It later became (1996) Higher Institute of Religious and Educational Sciences (ISSPR).

It was during the year 1993 that the fundamental cycle was born. It became in turn (1996) Religious and Educational Center (CERP). Therefore, some Brothers enrolled in the program for further training. Among the first students were: Frederick Douala (Douala), Corentin ZANGBOT (Douala) and NZEYI-MANA Jean-Baptiste.(Rwanda)[...] Among the pioneers, Frederic Douala is the only one who remained in the Institute.

However, it is split into two houses: Saint Miguel community in Riviera 3 which hosts scholastics in first and second year, and that of Cocody welcomes those in third year. Both houses are different and independent from the CELAF-Institute, where our scholastics continue their academic training in religious studies and teaching.

CLAF 2011: 30 Days preparation for Final vows.

In accordance with Article 97a of the Rule of the Institute which states that *"The Brother Visitor and the Commission for Formation organize, if necessary, in cooperation with other Districts, suitable programmes for the period that immediately precedes the making of perpetual vows"*, the CLAF 2011, took place from July 16 to August 14 in the Democratic Republic of Congo, the District of Congo Kinshasa, at Theresianum Center which is run by Carmelites.

RECONSTRUCTION OF THE HOUSE IN COCODY



The wall fence collapsed due to Heavy rain.

Reconstruction works of the Brothers' house in Cocody has began.

Perhaps, some of you still remember the photos sent by Brother Marius at the peak time of the Ivorian crisis. Indeed, in these photos, we can clearly see bullet holes on walls, windows, ceilings, doors and roof of the storeyed-house which had hosted third year scholastic Brothers, staff, the chaplain and the office of the Regional Councilor shortly before the damage. Fortunately, they had evacuated the scene a few days before.

Since the sudden departure of the Brothers, this residence has remained empty, otherwise unoccupied because the damage to the building were such that the reconstruction is essential.

As a matter of fact, an

important part of the wall fence collapsed on some twenty five yards from the entrance side, exposing the home to all the dangers.

So it was urgent that this must be done first. These works require financial means, which the region lacked. Fortunately, the good news is that the funding request submitted to the center of the Institute found a favorable response.

Since November 27, workers from the COMPANY Zura ALASANE have worked hard to reconstruct the wall first, then we will complete replacement of the roof of the storeyed-house, patching walls, replacing some paneling,

ceilings and screens and others. Meanwhile, the third year scholastic Brothers will complete their current academic year at Saint Miguel Scholasticate Community, Riviera III.

The new Regional team is temporarily in "Bon Pasteur" Community.

Thanks to the Superior General and his Council, to Brother General Bursar for his diligence.

The cost of reconstruction amounted to twelve million five hundred and eight thousand two hundred sixty nine CFA-francs.
