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# Editorial

It would be more helpful that these reflections be put in writing to be published. As we made it clear in the previous issues, our wish is to have many articles in the newsletter. Therefore do not hesitate to send us as many as possible articles.*

In this issue, we discover interesting educational experiences and formation. Despite the challenges encountered, the Novitiate in Eritrea is doing well: four young Brothers just completed their formation and pronounced their first vows. Thank God for His wonderful works. In Ethiopia, we discover a new Lasallian school which is to welcome children with HIV / AIDS. A good opportunity to give chance to these children who seemed abandoned by fate. We are also amazed by what is happening or is planned in CELAF-Institute: the two formation workshops on Child Protection and the Lasallian Pedagogy. These workshops should result in training modules in CELAF who is currently diversifying both its formation and its target audience: after the introduction of Masters program, CELAF prepares to open new courses which will be effective next September: This is among others a Professional Master in Law which consists of four entries: Master in social Law, Master in Law of Contracts, Master in Business Law and Taxation and Master in Legal and Financial Management. These courses give a large place to Lay people, especially those who cannot be free for day classes. We encourage all those who have spared no effort to contribute to innovation in Education and Formation for the benefit of the youth.

Let us make a special mention to the work of Lasallian Volunteers of Cameroon. Former Lasallian Students wanted to share their experience with those who have not had the chance to enjoy the same formation as they did.

Little by little, a determined group of volunteers was formed and today have launched their brand new training center with funding from PROYDE. They had to put their thoughts on it and have the courage to complete this project that some people found unrealistic in the beginning. Congratulations to the Lasallian Volunteers of Cameroon and that your example will inspire others for the development of the Lasallian Mission in the world.

Bilingualism in RELAF is on the way. Immersion is an effective way to learn new languages. In many school systems, an important place is given to foreign languages. Several hours are often spent on learning these languages. Ultimately it often leads to the same conclusion: enormous difficulties to communicate in these languages. The secret is in the practice. Courses only serve as support. But the courses without the support of continuous practice do not lead very far. The experience of the French Speaking Scholastics in Anglophone zone is quite significant. In a short time and in an environment that speaks mainly English, these young people have passed their test to fully study in this new language. Yet, how many years had they spent trying to learn this language? To make the experience complete, English speaking Scholastics should also do their formation in Francophone zone and within a short time, the language barrier will only be a memory.

# The New Centre Mutien Marie

*After spending more than a decade "squatting" from Douala to Mbalmayo, the Centre Mutien Marie of the Lasallian Volunteer of Cameroon was finally installed in their own and definitive site in Mbokoulou, a suburb of Mbalmayo, a town about 50 km from Yaounde, the political capital of Cameroon.*

Indeed, the long evenings of prayer and fasting for the completion of a project with PROYDE eventually bore fruit in abundance: the new Centre Mutien Marie brand new: nine classrooms, a workshop block, an administrative block, a computer block, library and toilets, all with a magnificent panoramic view.

.It was precisely in 2005 that the Coordinator for Lasallian Volunteers of Cameroon initiated the project of the new Centre Mutien Marie. This project being supported by the District of Douala has finally found a favorable response from PROYDE, a development and supporting organization to the Lasallian Educational Mission of the De La Salle Brothers in Spain. PROYDE found the project relevant, agreed with the approach of the Lasallian Volunteers and decided to fully support the project by giving a substantial grant to cover the cost of all work.

It all began with the symbolic laying of the foundation stone in January 2010, followed a few months later by a the real construction work.

# Golden Jubilee

*Two significant apostolates have celebrated their Golden Jubilee, 50th anniversary to the service of Lasallian Educational Mission. These include CETI (Industrial College of Technical Education) or Saint Joseph College of Diang, in the District of Douala (Cameroon) and the Private School Stella Maris, in Tamatave, in the District of Antananarivo. **Fifty years is not given to anyone, it's an anniversary that worth noting***

## What is a Jubilee?

For those who would be interested in the word, the French dictionary, *Le Nouveau Petit Robert* defines this word as "a public solemnity celebrated once every fifty years among the Jews." It brought the remission of all debts, the restitution of all 'heritage' to the previous owners, land redistribution and release of all slaves.

The word Jubilee is a biblical word that the Church uses to describe the celebration of a period of 25, 50, 75 or 100 years. In everyday language, we speak of birthday, fiftieth or hundredth anniversary.

Regarding the Bible, we have chosen two books that evoke the celebration of the jubilee: in the book of Leviticus 25, 8 said that every fiftieth year is called "Jubilee". It is a year dedicated to God. This is a year of the Lord and each returned to his "heritage": debts, sins, sentences were handed. The slaves were freed, the earth must rest: working in the fields was suspended (fallow lands). In Luke 4, 16-19, Jesus presents himself as one who gives meaning to the ancient Jubilee. He came to proclaim the year of grace of the Lord, proclaim the Good News to the poor, free the oppressed, restore peace in the world.



For the other meaning, let us remember that the years 2010 and 2011 saw the celebration of the golden jubilee of independence of African countries. Thus, it is called Silver Jubilee for 25 years of age; Golden Jubilee for 50 years and the Diamond Jubilee for 75 years. It is therefore a religious celebration that became a secular one. [...]

Thus, any Jubilee is an occasion to pray for peace, justice, reconciliation and forgiveness. In the Catholic Church, the Jubilee has taken the form of the Holy Year instituted by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300.

The Industrial College of Technical Education (CETI), Saint Joseph of Diang is located to the east of Cameroon. It was established two years after Cameroon's independence under the leadership of Archbishop Lambert Van HEHGUEN who had care for the education of the Cameroonian youth.



The delicate educational mission was entrusted to the Congregation of Brothers of the Christian Schools specialist in this area in 1962. It is now 50 years that the Brothers are present there. Some have already been called to God, others are still living with the burden of age. We are grateful for their generosity and the missionary impulse that led them into the forests of eastern Cameroon. They trained young people, some have become religious Brothers in the Institute founded by Saint John Baptist de La Salle.

Since its foundation until date, the CETI St. Joseph which includes the lower and upper secondary has known 13 Brothers who successively served with dedication as Directors of the School.

## Launch of activities for the Jubilee year

On 5 May 2012, the day chosen for the launch of festivities celebrating the golden jubilee of CETI Diang. From 7 o'clock in the camps were unusually busy. A human tide came to live the big event, this historical moment of this institution located in the forest, in the Sunrise Region of Cameroon, is rushing to the field arranged for the occasion.

Of this huge crowd from all parts of Cameroon and neighboring countries (Chad, Central Africa), there were students, former students, teachers, parents, administrative and civil authorities, priests, nuns and religious, youth, children, friends, then the curious.

On the menu of the day, there was Mass in the morning with fraternal agape available to students and children, and in the evening, the launch of the selected activities for the Jubilee followed by an evening gala.

A triple thanksgiving marked the celebration: the workers of CETI Diang gave thanks to God for the day May 1, Labour Day and patronal Feast of CETI. The official opening of the Jubilee year was punctuated with speeches by the Alumni representative of CTIE Diang, the Director, the Director of the College St. Jean Baptiste of Doumé, the Mayor of Diang, Brother Visitor of the District of Douala (Cameroon-Chad), the Deputy Prefect Diang.

From the various interventions of each other, we found essentially the tribute to the Brothers of the Christian Schools for the Educational Mission carried out in this part of Cameroon.

Since 1962, CETI has trained Government officers of the past and today. The majority of the elite in this town have gone through this school. The word of Brother Gilbert, the Director, while praising the work done so far, deplores the considerable decrease in numbers. In 1994, the boarding school had 300 inmates. Today, the total number of students does not reach that figure. He issued an invitation to stakeholders in the education system of Cameroon in general and Diang in particular that CETI, the pride of the citizens of today and yesterday, may not die 50 years after its foundation.

After these interventions, the guests enjoyed special dishes taken directly from the forest. They were also quick to show some dancing steps before leaving the place.

## STELLA MARIS: Golden Jubilee

(1962—2012)



*Stella Maris Private School is located in Tamatave, a town in the eastern part of Madagascar, about 350 km from the capital Antananarivo. It is the second school founded by the De La Salle Brothers after St Joseph Primary School in the same town. At its fiftieth anniversary, Stella Maris continues to take up the challenge of providing a better human and religious education to approximately 3250 students.*

### Historical Overview

**I**n 1962, the first four Missionary French Brothers to undertake the then new college, welcomed their first students in the three pavilions (classrooms for 6th, 5th, 4th grade today). Gradually, as the number of students increased, the Brothers continued to develop the place to build new classrooms, a laboratory, a large hall and football pitches and basketball-Ball.

Ten years later (1972), due to the socio-political crisis in the Great Island, there only remained Brother Louis AGNELLET, The School Director at the time. The number of students was so small that the school could no longer function properly for five years. So it was the most difficult moment for Stella Maris, but with the help of parents, Brother AGNELLET launched the challenge that drives us until today: "TSY MISY MAFY TSY LAITRY ZOTO," which literally means : « *nothing is difficult if one is willing.* »

It was after this relaunch that the upper secondary was opened; Stella Maris School gradually developed and made its reputation for excellent results in academics and sports.

From the year 1995, the Director, Brother Xavier RAJOFERSON opened a Technical Section for Management (currently FTG). He also took the initiative to build the wall around the School and other classrooms for students whose total number reached 2000.

At the time when Brother Juan SALLA COLL was the Director (1998-2003), Stella Maris underwent great transformation and development in terms of infrastructure (auditorium, chapel, toilets etc ...) and environment: tree planting and the creation of the nature club, Makako English Club and the creation of Young Lasallian group whose presence is significant to this day by their various activities based on the three Lasallian pillars: *FAITH FRATERNITY and SERVICE.*

Since its 40th anniversary in 2003 until 2009, many projects were completed and made available to 2900 students at the time and teachers. These include a school cafeteria, three new classrooms, paving the ground for Basketball, Internet connection, web site, general map of the School, an evidence of its openness to globalization as the Director of that time, Brother Etienne RAZAFINDRAIBE said: "*Stella Maris is a school of the third millennium*"

Today, Stella Maris demonstrates a long journey in the service of the Malagasy young people throughout the 50 years of history. Thanks to the efforts of all educators and Brothers, the administration and management of the School are improving.

The Golden Jubilee Celebration began on May 8, 2011 and was closed in May 19, 2012 by the various festive activities. Reasons to celebrate!


# Lasallian Family and Association

# CELAF INSTITUTE

## TWO SEMINARS SIMULTANEOUSLY

From 16 to 22 April 2012, two formation seminars were held in CELAF Institute. One focuses on Child Protection and another on Lasallian pedagogy.

It was an initiative of the Secretariat for Solidarity and Development and RELEM (Lasallian Region of Europe and Middle East) in agreement with the Director of CELAF and in accordance with the initiative C4, 2 of the Strategic Plan for RELAF, I quote: **"Ensuring continuing formation for the Brothers and Lay partners in the development and Child Protection"**

The first seminar was led by Miss Angela MUTUALLI, who came from Rome for the occasion and Ms. Koumba BAMA, an Ivorian Lawyer expert on Children's Rights. During the session, a rereading of international, regional and national tools relating to the protection of children was done. Major emphasis was given to the various forms of abuse, maltreatment and exploitation of children.

The purpose of the seminar is to sensitize participants to the knowledge of Children's Rights, knowledge that will enable them to adopt prevention strategies wherever they are in protecting Children's Rights. The many denunciations of the Children's Right violation throughout the world in recent years have motivated all development organizations (Donors) to put particular emphasis on Child Protection. So that for all development projects, especially projects related to Education and human development, these donors always require as master piece, the presentation of a protocol on the protection of Children's Rights. This protocol is nothing more than the policy implementation or should be implemented by local Educational Institutions to prevent any abuse or violation of Children's Rights. And since everything is not always obvious, it is necessary and essential to raise awareness today among the Brothers and their partners through training sessions and seminars.

The pilot experience began with CELAF-Institute. It involved all students of CERP (Centre d'Education Religieuse et Pédagogique) and ISSPR (Institut Supérieur de Science Pédagogique et Religieuse), the first two training structures of CELAF-Institute based in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire. The same formation will also be held in CTIE (Christ the Teacher Institute for Education) in Nairobi. If these various pilot experiences would prove successful, we shall introduce and consider this subject as part of the training program of scholastics. The same seminar is planned for the Sector of Ethiopia in October, this time for the benefit of teachers.

The second seminar on the other hand, is designed for Students-Teachers, that is the Students of CAFOP (Centre d'Animation et de Formation Pédagogique) and was led by Brother Josean VILLALABEITA from Madrid, Spain. The latter has rolled out the red carpet of the Lasallian pedagogy for Students conquered a tricentenary pedagogy that did not stop to seduce and that will seduce more. Truly speaking, the "Cafopians" have been convinced by that other so-called Lasallian Pedagogy. A plus and a novelty in the process of their Formation.



## *CELAF-Institute wants to broaden its audience*

CELAF-Institute has just celebrated its 20 years of excellence at the service of the Church mission in Africa. Building on its reputation and confidence in the future, this young Lasallian Institution seeks to diversify its formation program to reach a wide audience. The announcement of the introduction of a new Masters was made by Brother Emmanuel Mboua, the Director at the closing Mass of the festivities marking the 20th anniversary of this renowned Lasallian Institute in Africa.



In fact, before this announcement, a case study related to the opening of new Masters has been presented to the Brother Visitors' Conference of the French Speaking zone which approved it. This is a Professional Master in Law which has four entities: Master in Social Law, Master in Law of Contracts, Master in Business Law and Taxation and Master in Legal and Financial Management.

An authorization was given by the Conference to carry out this project, the Director of CELAF-Institute brought together potential stakeholders in the process to a first workshop on May 25, 2012. Apart from the executive team members of CELAF, this workshop was attended by distinguished guests, mostly PhDs, Researchers, all Educators in the country's two main Universities namely the University of Cocody and that of Bouake.

Was discussed during the workshop: to compare the curriculum and the objectives of courses offered, present models, the major and minor academic units and the proposed names of lecturers likely to provide the various branches considered.

From the discussion that followed, it was noted that there was a great interest shown by all participants as to the relevance of the three areas, the profile and conditions of recruitment of candidates, not to mention the sensitive issue of the post training opportunities. Implicitly, it also seeks to expand the record for the application for accreditation with the Ministry, a kind of mandatory permission before opening.

Generally, the discussions were constructive. All participants were willing to do things right. This resulted in programming other meetings where we shall specify the number of hours per unit and appropriate titles to be assigned to each Masters. Participants unanimously agreed that it must involve professionals in the validation of the program and models for it is they who are able to define the profile of future skills required for business needs. Because there is no reason of forming for the sake of forming, but we must train candidates ready to use, and to do this and training in line with employment is the sine qua non. Are they not also the innovations brought by the LMD? It should be noted that CELAF-Institute recently adopted the LMD system and will soon have its first graduates in Masters: Professional Masters in Business Administration and School Management

NB: What you should know, reassures the Director, the introduction of new branches will not affect conventional branches of study, ISSPR, CERP and CAFOP because the new Masters courses will take place in the evening, from 18 hours.

We were welcomed in Nairobi at De La Salle Centre which is the International Scholastic community of Charles Lwanga District. The warm and friendly welcome of both formators and Scholastic Brothers helped us to be quickly integrated in our new family. The language i.e. English was not overly a barrier to affect our openness to communicate. We realize that the Lasallian spirit and the brotherhood in De La Salle are strongly lived in various ways with regard to the socio-cultural and religious factors of the milieu.

The support and attention to one another are felt among the Brothers in the Scholastic and that enable us to improve our English and to enter in the process of both human and spiritual formation.

Sport activities and evening social every Friday is an opportunity to relax after a stressful week and this allows Brothers to socialize. Given the fact that we all come from different countries, we learn from one another and enrich each other. Some Brothers saw in our presence an opportunity to improve their French learned in the Postulancy or Novitiate and for few in secondary school. They are happy to practice French songs during community prayers and masses we are teaching them. Some are thinking about going to French speaking District/ Sector in the future for their apostolate.



Before joining Christ The Teacher Institute for Education (CTIE) at Tangaza College, we passed through Hekima Language Services LTD, a Language Centre and culture instruction and whose syllabus is tailored to cater for language for both communication and academic purposes. It greatly helped us to improve our English. Reading, writing, speaking and listening were the main activities involved in classes under the guide of an instructor. The tea-break was a great moment of interaction amongst multicultural students and with the staff members. At the end of the program at Hekima Language Services, we can say that our experience was a fruitful one.

When we joined CTIE, the challenges were mainly the fluency of the language and the fact that we have been introduced to a new academic system; i.e. American. However, both the support of the Brothers in community and the heartfelt welcome of the CTIE community encouraged us to be quickly integrated and actively participate in the life of the Institute and the overall Tangaza College of which CTIE is also a constituent part. Sports, community services and other socio-cultural activities are opportunities given to the students to interact and enrich each other.

We acknowledge that the various opportunities being offered in CTIE and the openness of the students to share their knowledge make learning easier and beneficial.

## **From the Sector of Ethiopia – Opening of Saint John Baptist de La Salle School**



### In remembrance of Brother Yemanu Jehar




