

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# Editorial

D

ear Brothers, dear Lasallians

I felt happiness going through the articles of this Newsletter N°21. They have easily found echo in me because they are all grounded in the framework of our beautiful mission of educators. During the pastoral visit in Rwanda, Equatorial Guinea, Chad and then in Madagascar, Robert Schieler, our General Superior, never ceased to remind that as Brothers of the Christian Schools, we are made to teach and that our primary role is to teach. What does it then mean for us to teach? It is up to each Brother, each Lasallian, to ask themselves this question and to look for an answer. What do we teach? The answer seems obvious everywhere: there are different "subjects", also called "disciplines", laid down by the formal programs... But beyond these specific subjects, or let us say through them, and regardless of the one that we teach, what do we teach, fundamentally and transversely? While teaching inculcates subjects, education makes a person to mature. In fact, both are complementary such that it is not possible to completely separate them ...

If the word of God became flesh and **dwelt** among us, he teaches us in this way something essential to our condition of human beings. The role of the Lasallian educator, Brother or lay, isn't it precisely to teach children to dwell? Today we are becoming more and more aware of how human beings dwell badly, have difficulty to dwell in harmony with nature, to dwell among themselves, to dwell together as brothers and sisters with the others... Human beings need to learn to dwell. Do we teach children entrusted to our care to dwell? To know how to dwell is a matter of science, knowledge of the natural and social environment. It is also a question of languages and history, faith and reason... but this implies also the sense of justice, equity... Do we teach our pupils and students to be attentive to all those who have difficulty finding hospitality in the world?

The educator, in order to teach children and young people how to dwell, cannot stick only to be a pedagogue. He must become a witness... it is in giving hospitality to the other, not only in one's house but in one's heart that we show that we know how to dwell or not. Behold is the Child Jesus who comes and he neither wants other crib, nor other palace than our heart. Has he found hospitality, a condition so that we can give him to the world?

# Kenya : Spanish Volunteers at St La Salle School Karameno

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Five Spanish volunteers arrived at St. La Salle School Karameno on Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> July 2016 just some few minutes past 6:00pm. This was the first group of volunteers from Spain to visit the new apostolate of the Brothers in Lwanga District of Africa.

The five were involved in refurbishing one of the old buildings in the school premises, in order to convert it into girls' dormitory in preparation for next year form one intake. According to the Director, Bro. Stephen Mwaura, renovation was going to help a great deal. "We haven't gotten any funds to put up a new dormitory." he added.

The volunteers were sent by PROYDE and they stayed in Karameno for one month. They were involved in serious renovation work in the morning while in the afternoon they were joining students for games.

The leader of the group was a teacher in one of the Brothers' Schools in Spain while the rest were students in different universities. It is important to note that the five volunteers were all alumni of Lasallian schools in Spain and their visit created a special brotherly bond between Brothers' Schools in Spain and those in Kenya.



"The presence of these volunteers brought a big difference in the school and in the local community at large", Bro. Stephen said. He further added that the students were so excited and were cooperating and working well with the volunteers.

The five together with Bro. Stephen stopped for lunch at Golden Gate Hotel on their way to Karameno. It is interesting to note that for the five, this was their first meal ever in the African continent. "We can't take this for granted", one of the volunteers said. Meanwhile, St. La Salle School Karameno was officially opened on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2016. The new school is located in Karameno some few kilometers from Nyeri town in central Kenya. It is currently under the able stewardship of Bro. Stephen Mwaura.

This CIL began in October 16, 2016 with a participation in the Canonization Mass of Brother Salomon Leclercq. The formation gathered about fifty Lasallians from all the regions of the Institute. The RELAF was represented by a Brother and a lay partner, both from the District of West Africa, and Brother Ferdinand, the AMEL Coordinator for the region.

Where are we to plan for the future? The answer to this question was given through the sharing of experiences and some good practices across the Institute during the first two days of the formation.

We are in-between modernity and tradition; the educational tradition according to Saint John Baptist De La Salle and the current practice of education. Speaking of the "*evangelical itinerary of De La Salle: an inspiration for today*", Brother André Pierre Gauthier invited us to know how to read the events of our time alike De La Salle who saw the events of His time and which led him to found the school for the poor.

For the smooth running of the *Lasallian Mission today*, we should know the link existing between the *Gospel and the Lasallian Spirituality*. These topics presented to the CIL participants, comprising of lay people, men and women; Religious Brothers and Priests, showed us that the Lasallian formation for the mission is a culture. # Lomié - Cameroon : « I am a Baka, I have my first certificate »

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My name is NDAKOWE Gérard, I am thirteen years old. NDAKOWE means "the house with too many problems". I come from the village of Kungulu which is 40 km far from Lomié.

It was last year, in September 2015, that I have decided to come to the Brothers' Foyer in Lomié. One of my classmates, EKOUASSI Oscar was already a student in Lomié and he was good. I therefore wanted to join him in the Foyer. I had to walk on foot from Kungulu up to Lomié. When I arrived in the city, I did not know where to find the newly Foyer built by the Brothers. It is the district head of Madouma who took me to the Brothers.

I had just passed in middle class 2 and I wanted at all cost succeed in a formal examination. The Brothers welcomed me (especially Brother Narcisse). The latter asked me if I had come to Lomié to play or to attend seriously school. I replied that it is to attend school because in the village, it is difficult to attend school. It also happens that parents do not find the money necessary to pay for your tuition and the examination fees. So you swiftly drop out of school. Relationships with girls may also prevent you from going to school. Yet, it is through school that you will become a great and good person in future.

To prepare seriously for my primary school certificate examination, I had to make a lot of efforts: like going to school every day, accepting the severe discipline imposed by the teachers, doing rehearsals during the Easter vacation while the other comrades are hanging around in the neighbourhood and in the village. In addition, we did three times the mock exam to prepare ourselves well.

Before taking the examination in June 2016, we sat for the technical school first year entry exam in the month of May. As soon as I saw my name on the board, I told myself that I must do everything to succeed also my primary school certificate before going to the secondary school.

On 5 June 2016, I was ready to face my exam with a lot of fear in the stomach. When we arrived in the examination centre where we were to write, a thorough check is carried out by the female teacher before entering the examination class. I only remained with my pen and my other writing tools. The first exam was the dictation which focused on malaria. I found it fair. The following exams seemed to me easier because I took time to read each question before writing down the answers. The mathematics and English exams were complicated for me, but I tried to do the best I could.

It is at the end of the month of July that I learned through Brother Gilbert that my name has been read on the radio. I succeeded in my primary school certificate!!! I was particularly pleased with this good news, my mum too. She gave me the same day one thousand CFA francs to congratulate me on my success. She danced and sang the whole night because finally one of her sons got his certificate. I am therefore proud to have succeeded in my first certificate.

In the future, I am no longer worried because I can continue my studies at secondary school while staying in the Foyer and hope to get other certificates to earn worthily a decent life as a grown person.

I am NDAKOWE Gérard, now in first year carpentry in the Technical School of Lomié. I thank all the people who help us, we the Baka people, to be students. I say thank you and I pray dearly for all the Brothers of the Christian Schools and their partners who support us with their efforts. See you soon.

He arrived in Madagascar the afternoon of October 16, 2016, on the day of the Canonization of Brother Solomon Leclercq in Rome.

He was welcomed at the provincial house and remained there 3 days to rest and meet the Brother Visitor before heading to the region of Amoron'ny mania for his new mission as the school Principal of Saint Louis de Gonzague of Ambositra.

Sometimes, when a student is late, if he does not come with the entry permit, he is accompanied by the parents; therefore, the same way on 20 October, Brother Michel, accompanied by the Brother Visitor, Brother Etienne (Director of Community of Andohalo) and Brother Jean Marc (the District Secretary) went to his community for his new mission. The group of Brothers arrived around 4.00 pm in the community. The Brothers of the community as well as the entire school were very impatient to welcome their new Principal.

On the same day of the arrival of the group of Brothers in the school, a meeting was organized by the Brother Visitor to introduce the new Principal to the teaching staff. The Brother Visitor encouraged the members of the educational community to genuinely collaborate for the success of the Lasallian mission in the school. As for the new leader, he is ready to work for a common association in the Lycée Saint Louis de Gonzague so that the challenge of education may be overcome at the end of the year.



Teachers who were teaching and surprised by the arrival of the car of the Brother Visitor went out in the compound; the students, with joyful faces, stood to look through the windows, curious to know their new Principal.

The following day, October 21, the introduction of the Brother Principal was made at 8.00 am before the 856 students, from pre-school to Form Four. The students did not know yet which, of the 3 Brothers present at the Assembly, the new Principal was. The Brother Visitor took the floor and unveiled the identity of the new Brother Director; an outstanding round of applause followed.

The welcoming of the new Principal was triumphant among the students and the teachers. After the first speech of Brother Zo Michel to the students and teachers, the students happily joined their respective classes.

# Abidjan: Celebration of the 150 years of Brothers' presence in Madagascar




# Cameroon : De La Salle School settles on the Western Mountains

Bafang, St Paul's Cathedral, it is 2:30 pm this Sunday, August 22, 2016. A renowned travel agency huge bus has just dropped seventy people at the entrance to the reception centre. Two other small cars do likewise; a van brought a dozen people scouting the day before.

In the big compound, strong boys collect the material and everything. Most of them are wearing a blue and white tracksuit. They look proud. They are confident. They are robust. They feel comfortable. It is free time this afternoon anyway, so they take advantage. Bafang streets will be their next victims. Some stood there admiring the landscape or benumbed by the cold from these hills of the West Cameroon. The temperature reads 19 degrees Celsius. But the majority of the group is cheering. Soon, no place in this corner of the province is a secret to them. What do you expect? They are used to long distances and the hectic traffic of Douala. Seeing the clusters easily noticeable they've formed, some people of the neighbourhood are left in wonder. What is happening today in Bafang? Who are these people? Others do not bother. They take advantage of the crowd and get closer. But gradually the news goes round. Ah, it is De La Salle... Ah, people from Douala, from the technical education... "The Canadians"!

In fact they are specific competitors who are getting prepared. The marathon they are preparing takes place is the academic setup. The start off is in two weeks. The school management decided that the internship would this time be away from the base. The Canadians? They have gone long ago. It is a native who currently leads the boat. He is the boss. Main characteristic: he does his best. A heavy week of work awaits this educational team. Everything has been planned. The necessary equipment has been carried. Two experts with so eloquent pedigrees have been hired.

It is in an awesome atmosphere that the night falls on the first day of these Lasallians in Bafang. At 7.00 pm the supper including varied dishes is served. After the supper, they clean and set the table in a family atmosphere where everyone participates. Slowly, silence gets back in the place. Tomorrow, the program will kick off. It will start with a recollection. Everywhere there is calm, the stillness progressively takes over.

The young priest who has been solicited to guide this first morning of recollection is one of these synthetic minds that rarely use written text. He is also an orator in the art of giving conferences. From the first words, the audience is conquered. The teaching is embedded of stories describing real-life situations. He draws extensively from the Biblical directory where the books of Luke, Mathew, Philippians, Tobit are revisited. The central theme is mercy. In the afternoon, Brothers Frédéric Douala and Louis Pierre Kouemeni relay each other on the podium. They grab general ideas which inevitably mash too wide to project them in the particular context of the Lasallian milieu. Their statements are clear and simple. They speak in a very calm tone, relying on anecdotes drawn from their own experiences. At the closing of this first day, the minds are ready.



Everyone has the feeling of being energized. A new light illuminates the gaze of the participants and it radiates on the outside as a joy to live. It was really needed because all minds turn gradually to what is to come tomorrow. This is the chunk of this session.

For a long time, education in our country forms employees and not entrepreneurs. Yet, no country can emerge with a flunkey spirit youth, formatted to carry out rather than to decide. That is why the School has decided to introduce entrepreneurship as a subject for the students in Form Four as from the start of the school year 2016-2017. KUTCHE, the Knight of God chosen to guide this part is a graduate from four universities including two abroad. This gentleman managed the feat of delivering 14 units in one day. The different units were living stories. All of us discovered within ourselves the entrepreneurial fibre.

Friday was half devoted to a pedagogical training and the other half for the review of our disciplinary device. A topic guided our reflections: TEACHER, A CRUCIAL LINK IN THE PEDAGOGICAL CHAIN. At the end of the day, we felt exhaustion coming. We had the next morning our traditional big assembly whereby everything is perfected, including the finance. And that is where we are witnesses of a real revolution. What really obliges the Brothers of the Christian Schools to give us the accounts yet we do not represent their administration board? Here is a new paradigm shift. The closing Mass presided over by the cathedral parish priest of Bafang did only consolidate the feeling to belong to a great family.

We had a free Saturday afternoon. The most courageous left the Centre and went to say goodbye and this was prolonged until late in the night. In the meantime in the centre, the evening social was in full swing. Teachers changed into artists showed off their talent. The most sensational was no doubt Father Thomas Mongo, through a comedy presentation which provoked the hilarity of the whole group. On Sunday morning, the feet were still in Bafang while heads were already at home. The bus arrived, we loaded everything, people and material, and start off. Before 4.00 pm, everybody was at home.


